Did you know that:

- Murder is the 3rd leading cause of Death for Native American girls and young adults ages 10-34 according to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention?
- Indigenous women are the most stalked, raped and murdered of any women of any ethnic group in America according to the U.S. Department of Justice?
- In 2016 the DOJ reported 5,712 Indigenous women and girls that went missing or murdered in the U.S. alone?
- Canada's **“National Inquiry into Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls”** final report was comprised of testimony from more than 2,380 family members of victims of MMIWG?

There is a very real and present day contemporary crisis happening in Indian Country that knows no borders and is called the **“Murdered and Missing Indigenous Women and Girls crisis or MMIWG”**.

There are many reasons that make Indigenous women more vulnerable to these tragic crimes against humanity. One reason is transitory worker camps or extractive industry “Man-camps” that set up to do their work on or near Reservations. The camps drive a market for trafficked women and girls. Another is outdated laws which don't allow Tribal Law Enforcement jurisdiction over non-Natives. So if you are a non-Native and commit a major crime on a reservation, you cannot be arrested or prosecuted for this crime by Tribal Law enforcement. Another issues is the cartels that take advantage of loopholes in jurisdiction and inability to be prosecuted for major crimes that makes Indigenous women and girls more vulnerable. Let's not forget about the systemic impacts of extreme poverty and loss of agency, all of which debilitate and demoralize women and communities. This tragedy will require all of us to **join together to protect Indigenous women and girls**.

The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation opens with this poignant declaration: ***“At the core of every problem we're trying to solve, from poverty to disease, are the undervalued but powerful lives of women and girls. One of the most impactful ways to accelerate progress is to invest in women's and girl's movements. Yet, grassroots women's organizations and movements are severely underfunded and under threat.”*** **With House of the Moon, this is your chance to invest in one of these grassroots movements.** It's time we do more than merely help people survive: ***with your support, we can restore dignity, respect and the creative energy that Indigenous women and communities both embody, let alone deserve.***

While there is much that needs to change in order to address this devastating crisis, **this grassroots initiative is a solutions based program that is designed by and for the communities who are experiencing MMIWG tragic effects.** We are addressing the crisis from within instead of waiting for long processes and government systems or corporations to change. 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Our 2021 Pilot Training Program Success...

Seven Indigenous women from the U.S. and Canada became House of the Moon Facilitators. Each are now certified to offer culturally relevant empowerment and self-defense gatherings in their own Native communities. On April 27, 2021, these **7 Native Women graduated** from House of the Moon's Pilot Facilitator Training Program and are our Founding Facilitators. We are forever grateful for these courageous women who stepped forward and were the first to walk through the Empowerment and Self-Defense Training. We've been able to implement critical feedback, insights and improve our future programs.

Regeneration of Self-Worth, Empowerment, Healing, and Self-Definition of Indigenous Women, Girls, and Communities looks like this:

➔ **100% graduation rate** with women from multiple Tribes & First Nations in the U.S & Canada

➔ One graduate translated **HOM curricula** to be age appropriate **K-12**. They are now **offering gatherings in School District 58 in British Columbia.**

➔ The Facilitator Training Program **reached nearly 400 people from over 30 Tribes & First Nations**

➔ **90% of funds raised were invested in Indigenous Leadership, artists, & small businesses**

"I have been using the training that I received to apply to every aspect of my job. I am now the elected official representative of our Tribe for MMIP/MMIW & have been seated on the Attorney General's Task Force. I am also the Domestic Violence Coordinator for our Tribe & have been working on setting up a Coordinated Community Response Team for anyone who goes missing on the Reservation.
